





Figure 1. Distribution of responses to health insurance attitude items, adults age 18 and over, 2001, 2006, and 2011

Figure 2. Distribution of responses to health insurance attitude items, adults ages 18–64, 2001, 2006, and 2011






Figure 3. Distribution of level of persistence in response to health insurance attitude items, adults age 18 and over, 2001 and 2002






Figure 4. Distribution of level of persistence in response to health insurance attitude items, adults age 18 and over, 2010 and 2011




Figure 5. Percentage of adults who feel they are healthy and don't need health insurance, by selected characteristics, 2001


Figure 5a. Percentage of adults who feel they are healthy and don't need health insurance, by selected characteristics, 2011


Figure 6. Percentage of adults who feel that health insurance is not worth the cost, by selected characteristics, 2001
